



LESSON – 1: INTRODUCTION

In this introductory class we will go through the basics of musical notes and practice a song which every child knows. We will have to be innovative in how we get across, as every child will be different and prefer different ways to communicate.


1. We will need a keyboard, a simple 61 key one will be good enough.
2. We need some sticky letters to be able to use on the keyboard.
3. Talk to children about the pattern of black notes – 2,3,2,3,2,3.
4. We will start with practicing three notes – C, D & E.
5. Let the child place C sticky letter on the keyboard. It is to the left of two center black keys.



6. Have your child find all the C notes and place stickers on them.
7. Have child place D and E sticky letter on the keyboard as below:



8. Have the child press middle C using the thumb. Just left side of the thumb touching the key at the end.
9. Have the child press 'D' note using the pointer/ first finger and 'E' note using the Middle/Tall finger.



Next Practice distinguishing between C, D & E and take turns.

10. Child will play and practice MARY HAD A LITTLE LAMB using these three notes.

Mary had a Little Lamb


Ma-ry had a lit-tle lamb,

D D D E E E


Ma-ry had a lit-tle lamb,

C D D E D C


11. Next we will work on Whole note (count to 4), Half note (count to 2) and Quarter note (count to 1).




12. Below are the notes and the corresponding letters (C- Belly Cut, D-Under the line, E- On the line)




Below are the notes using letter and time delay (4 is FULL note =count to 4; 2 is HALF note =count to 2; rest are QUARTER notes =count to 1)
