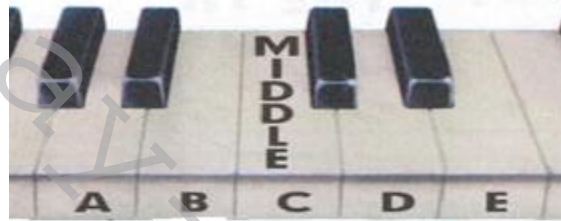


LESSON 3: We learned C, D and E in Lesson 1 using the Right hand. In this lesson we will be learning 2 new notes using the left hand – B and A. Middle C can be played with both Left and Right hand Thumb. These notes are on the left of middle C note as shown below:



is the sign for Treble cliff to be played with the Right hand.



is the sign for Bass cliff to be played with the Left hand.

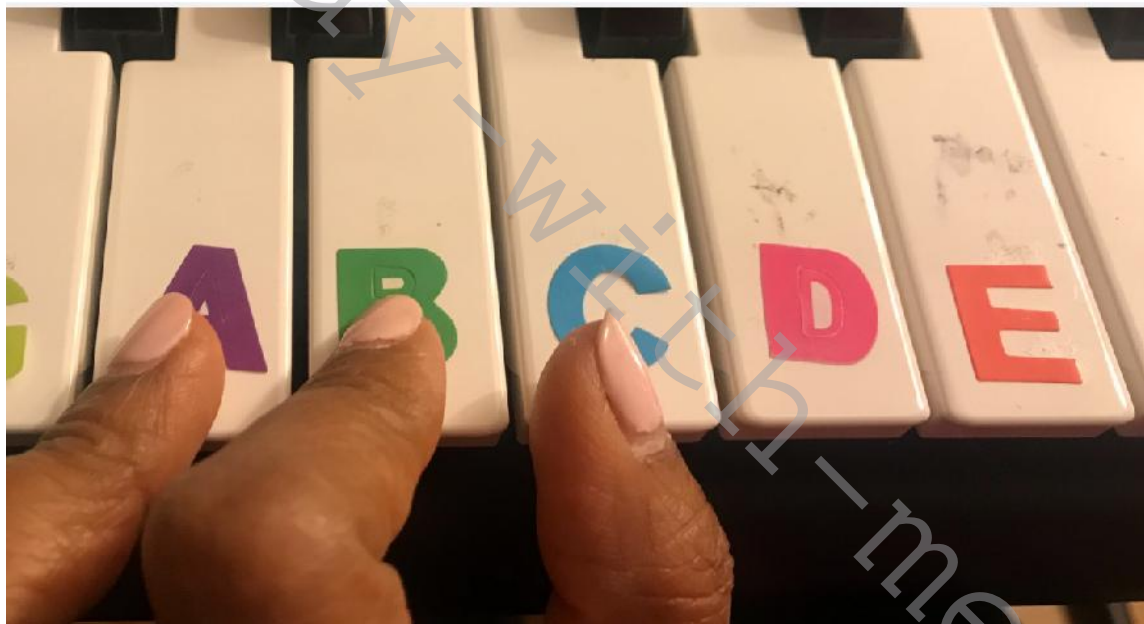
Put Stickers as shown below:



Marching Up and down

Finger position(Left Hand) :

C (1st finger - Thumb); B: (2nd finger - pointer); A: (3rd finger – Tall men);



Finger position(Right Hand) : Same as lesson 1.

C (1st finger - Thumb); D: (2nd finger - pointer); E: (3rd finger – Tall men);

Below are the notes using letter and time delay (4 is FULL note =count to 4; 2 is HALF note =count to 2; rest are QUARTER notes =count to 1)

Marching Up and Down
